



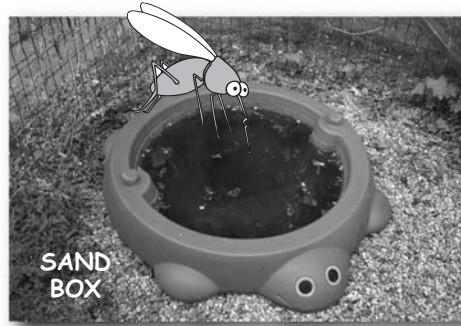
Here's one don't want playing in your backyard this summer.

DO YOUR BEST TO ELIMINATE STANDING WATER.

- Clean and refill bird baths at least once a week
- Empty stagnant water from unused containers
- Don't allow puddles to collect in your yard
- Keep tire swings free of water
- Stock ponds with fish
- Cover rain barrels with screening
- Clear gutters

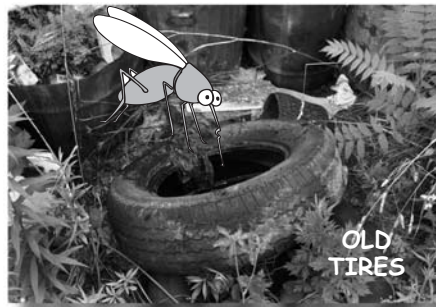
